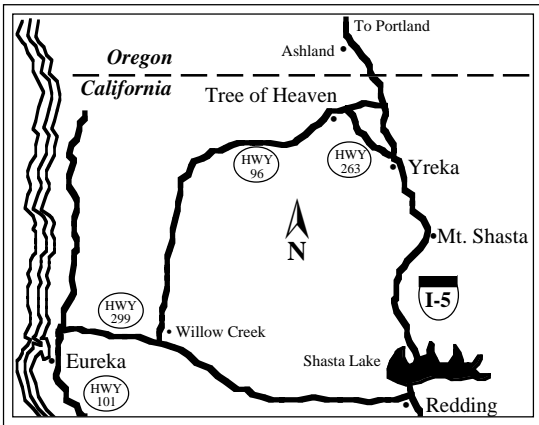


# KLAMATH RIVER

## A DAY OF WHITEWATER IN THE BEAUTIFUL KLAMATH VALLEY



### MEETING PLACE & TIME

We will meet you at 9:00 a.m. the morning of your trip at the boat ramp in the Tree of Heaven Campground.

Traveling north on Interstate 5, take the third Yreka exit (exit 776).

Turn left under the freeway, go to the first stop sign and turn right onto Hwy. 263.

When you come to Hwy. 96 (Klamath River Road) turn left. The campground is about 4 miles on your left.

Traveling south on I-5, Hwy. 96 is about 14 mi. below the Oregon border at the Collier Rest Stop. The campground is 6.5 mi.

### THE RIVER

Cascading out of the mountains of southern Oregon, the Klamath River runs free for 200 miles through the Siskiyou mountains of northern California. Second only to the Sacramento River in size, it is treasured for its many recreational opportunities, natural beauty, and diverse wildlife. The Klamath was one of the first rivers in California to be granted National Wild and Scenic status.

### INFLATABLE KAYAKS

Inflatable kayaks are small one-person boats. They are stable and easy to paddle. For those who wish an added adventure we bring a few kayaks on all of our Klamath trips. These are for general use and are provided at no charge. If you wish to reserve an extra kayak for yourself or to share with friends they are available for \$12.00 per day.

### WHAT TO BRING

Listed below are the items you will need for your trip. For spring and fall layers of wool or synthetic clothing are best. They dry out quickly and offer options to meet changing weather conditions. Cotton and down dry out slowly and have little insulating value when wet. However, during the summer a long-sleeved cotton t-shirt and a hat can provide protection from the sun and keep you cool.

### ON THE RIVER:

- swimsuit/shorts
- cotton t-shirt (summer)
- windbreaker
- tennis shoes or river sandals (not aqua socks)
- sunglasses & strap
- sunhat
- sunscreen lotion/lip balm

### OPTIONAL:

- water bottle
- spare glasses or contacts
- binoculars
- camera

### GENERAL TRIP INFORMATION

**SAFETY** • Instruction in river safety procedures is given before your trip. Our guides are certified in first aid and CPR. A wilderness first-aid kit and safety equipment are carried on all trips. Please advise us if you have any food allergies or health problems. All recreational activities involve an element of risk. Our insurance requires that you sign a release of liability before your trip.

**MEALS** • Our lunch menu is a buffet featuring: whole grain breads, cold cuts, a variety of cheeses, avocados, tomatoes and fruit juice (PB & J is always available). Cold sodas are provided at the end of each trip. Please let us know if you have any diet requests.

**EQUIPMENT** • We use HYSIDE inflatable rafts with 4 to 6 paddlers and a guide per boat. All accessory equipment is provided including Coast Guard approved life-jackets, helmets for inflatable kayaking, and waterproof boxes for cameras and binoculars.

**TIPPING** • You will find that your guides work very hard to insure an exceptional river trip. They are highly skilled professionals who enjoy sharing their love and knowledge of the Klamath with you. A gratuity is warmly appreciated.
